

**Greenwood Gun Club High Power Division
2021 Match Program**

Tournament Name: Greenwood Gun Club Across-the-Course Match

Tournament Type: CMP Approved High Power Rifle Club Match (200/300/600)

Tournament Dates: January 16, February 20, Mar 20, April 17, May 15, June 19, July 17, September 18, November 20, December 18

Sponsored By: Greenwood Gun Club, Brazoria County, Texas

Range Location: Eight miles north of Brazoria, Texas, located on County Road 508, East of County Road 521

Competition: Open to the public

Entry Fee: \$20.00 for adults; juniors shoot free

Entry Registration: Registration begins at 0700 the date of the match and closes at 0730

Firing Begins: 0800

Rules: All rules as published in the current version of CMP Highpower Rifle Competition Rules. There will be no alibi's allowed for malfunctions or defective cartridges; range and pit alibi's will be allowed.

Course of Fire: 80 shot match with sighting shots – total of 88 rounds
20 rounds slow fire standing @200 yards; 2 sighting shots
20 rounds rapid fire sitting @ 200 yards; 2 sighting shots
20 rounds rapid fire prone @ 300 yards; 2 sighting shots
20 rounds slow fire prone @ 600 yards; 2 sighting shots

Targets to be Used: 200 yards- SR; 300 yards – SR3; 600 yards - MR

Scoring: Electronic Targets will be used

Rifles: No Muzzle Breaks allowed.

Service Rifle - Rules 3.1(a-c)

Ammunition: No bullet with a diameter greater than 308 inch will be allowed. 55 grain .223 is not allowed at 600 yards.

Tracer, incendiaries, armor piercing ammo is not permitted. Ammunition must be safe. Bullets must remain supersonic at the target and the match director will have right to remove the competitor/ammunition from the line if the bullet is not supersonic. Any ammo that repeatedly blows primers or splits cases will be ruled defective or unsafe and the competitor/ammunition

will be removed from the firing line. Any competitor that cannot stay on target will be removed from the firing line. The match director can remove any competitor from the firing line if he rules the rifle, ammo or competitor is unsafe.

Chamber Flags: An Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI) is required to be inserted unless the rifle is in a case or rifles are being used by competitors on the firing line during preparation period or actual firing (rule 10.1.1). Upon firing the last shot the ECI must be re-inserted and the magazine removed before the competitor gets out of firing position. The rifle must be removed from the firing line with an ECI in place before the rifle is put into a case. ECIs are available for purchase.

Classifications: Standard CMP High Power Classifications will apply to all competitors. Competitors without CMP classification will fire in the Master category or may fire with their NRA Classification
